It is impossible to predict right now. Please watch your inboxes and continue checking the announcements in your bulletin for more information.



UPDATE ON THE NAVAJO MISSION!

Here is just one example of how the Navajo Lutheran Mission is using **MLC's generous donations:**

Tyrell and his wife have 4 children living in a



home located 5 miles Southeast of Rock Point Lutheran Mission. The home has no running water or electricity. The water line is located about 20 yards from the home and electricity line is about 2 miles. The family uses a gas generator daily to light their home. With the

price of gasoline, they limit the hours of the generator time. Before the family installed the solar system they could not buy fresh meat or vegetables because the shelf life is very limited. Since they connected the solar system, it runs a small refrigerator and battery recharging system. The family supplements the solar system with running the gas generator.

The family is able to run the refrigerator to keep produce and food frozen. The solar system improved the quality of food they are able to eat.

NELM MISSION VISITATION

Magnolia Lutheran Church's Social Action Committee is planning a mission visitation to Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission in 2022 and 2023. The visitation this summer is planned for June 30, 2022 to July 7, 2022. The visitation in 2023 will be determined at a later date but will not replicate the 2022 dates. There are numerous volunteer opportunities on the 5-acre campus, they are varied and will accommodate a variety of volunteer gifts and talents. Since we will be there over a holiday there will also be time for rest and relaxation; perhaps hike to Rock Point or visit Canyon de Chelly. If you choose to drive, there are many national parks along the way to Rock Point is a great opportunity to include time to visit these wonders.

God's beloved people,

Welcome back. It has been three years since we celebrated Easter in the sanctuary. While the virus has not yet lifted, we a grateful that we are able to return to this space and sing our hymns of praise.

Early on, our Council decided to follow the King County Health Department Guidelines for Faith Communities. As a result, for over two years our doors were shut, but the ministry of the church never stopped. Now, as we begin to gather back together it seems right and good to share a few thoughts.

Masks are welcome, but not required. In addition, there are "social distancing" necklaces that are available you in the narthex. By wearing these beads you are telling others that you prefer a socially distanced greeting and an elbow bump. Should you wish a bit more space, we hear you, and you are welcome here.

Second, all are welcome to receive communion. We have temporarily changed our communion practice to adapt to pandemic needs. Wine and grape juice is distributed through tiny cups. Everyone who prepares communion is fully vaccinated and boosted. We trust that Christ is fully present in the bread and wine. If you do not wish to receive communion, you are invited to come forward and receive a blessing.

Also, Children's Ministries are returning. The Atrium is back in session. The Atrium is a faith-based Montessori —method of inviting children to encounter the wonder of Godwith-us. We also have an active Confirmation Class for Middle School youth that meets with me on Wednesdays at 4pm and 4:30pm by zoom.

Music is returning. The choir meets on Wednesdays at 7pm. The Bell Choir meets on Wednesdays at 5pm. There are no auditions. Musical experience is helpful but not necessary. All are welcome.

Looking to make new friends? Come to our Quilters Gathering. The first meeting post -pandemic is May 5 at 10am. Simply show up. All are welcome.

Finally, should there be another spike of the pandemic, we will consult the King County Health Department Guidelines then adapt and flex...just as we have done. This we know... if we need to shut our doors, this ministry of Christ-with-us as we serve our neighbor will go on and not miss a beat.
