HELPING OUR NEIGHBORS IN NEED

NELM—WHERE IT BEGAN

The Mission began its work in Rock Point in 1954, with the building of a small clinic and nurses' residence. The building was used to attend to patients, house nurses, and even set-up for church services on Sunday's. As the Mission grew, the small clinic expanded into a 2 bed hospital, and for over 40 years served the medical needs of the community. Thanks to a devoted Nurse, Elsie Benson, who worked at the clinic for over 25 of those years, many people were given needed medical treatment. The building was named Benson Hall after the nurse who did so much for the community.

Today the clinic is operated through a partnership with Tachiinii Nursing Services, Inc. Ivan Jones, Nurse and owner, is a Rock Point resident committed to providing the best possible healthcare for the community.

A group from MLC will be traveling to Rockpoint at the end of June and will be taking all of the donations with them to hand deliver to the children. They're going to be so happy! ANOTHER FUNDRAISER FOR UKRAINE!

Russia invaded Ukraine on February 24th, 2022. Who ever thought that over three months later, they would still be at it? At least 46,000 dead, over 400 missing, 15,000 displaced, over 2,000 buildings destroyed and estimated property damage is approximately 600 billion dollars, yes, that says billion, with a "b".

Our bake sale was such a hit and talked about amongst the community, that one resident reached out to MLC and asked if they could use Luther Hall to hold a concert (Rock & Roll from the 60s, 70s & 80s) to benefit Ukraine. **The concert will take place on Saturday, June 18th at 7:30pm in Luther Hall.** There will be games, food, live music, beer & wine and dancing. There is no fee to get in but lots of opportunities to make a donation to benefit the Ukrainian refugees. There will also be a trio from Ukraine performing. It's sure to be a fun event! Let's see if we can raise another \$11k!



CAN'T MAKE IT TO ARIZONA? YOU CAN STILL HELP!!

As stated above, the Social Action Committee of MLC is planning a mission trip to the Navajo Evangelical Lutheran Mission (NELM), Rockpoint, Arizona in late June. There will be opportunities to provide sponsorships for four children and one classroom as well as solar panels and generators. The sponsorships for the children include items that are needed for the school, i.e., fuel, food, hygiene, books and supplies. Many of you have voiced your interest in NELM but are unable to go in June. I have been in contact with NELM and have been advised that **the current inventory of children's clothes is nonexistent. The items requested are, most especially, underwear, socks, pajamas, athletic clothing, shorts and long pants for both boys and girls. The children range from 5 to 9 years old. We will begin gathering clothes in the Narthex in May.** Both gently used and new are welcome. Once again, I am very thankful for this generous congregation.
