

WE HEAR GOD'S WORD

FIRST READING: Jeremiah 23:23-29

SECOND READING: Hebrews 11:29-34; 12:1-2



For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets—"who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight.

12:1 Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.


Words of Institution (In the night he was betrayed...)

All are invited to the Table. Come as you wish. The ushers will guide you by row.


The pastor distributes the bread. Others will distribute wine and grape juice. Simply take a pre-poured glass and return it to the empty tray.






