



Before the reading: Glory to you, O Lord!




Preface: It is indeed right, our duty, and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise ... we praise your name and join their unending hymn:

All are invited to the Lord's Table. Come as you wish. The ushers will guide you by row.


At Magnolia Lutheran Church, we receive communion by intinction, which is the practice of dipping the bread into the chalice.








MAKE AN IMPACT, DONATE BLOOD. SAVE A LIFE.
