



WE HEAR GOD'S WORD

FIRST READING: Isaiah 49:1-7

Listen to me, O coastlands,
pay attention, you peoples from far away!

The LORD called me before I was born,



The Great Thanksgiving



Words of Institution (In the night he was betrayed...) Lord's Prayer


