

WE HEAR GOD'S WORD

FIRST READING: Isaiah 58:9b-12

^{9b}If you remove the yoke from among you, the pointing of the finger, the speaking of evil, ¹⁰if you offer your food to the hungry and satisfy the needs of the afflicted, then your light shall rise in the darkness and your gloom be like the noonday. The LORD will guide you continually, and satisfy your needs in parched places. and make your bones strong; and you shall be like a watered garden, like a spring of water, whose waters never fail. ¹²Your ancient ruins shall be rebuilt; you shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach. the restorer of streets to live in.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 2:1-12 [13-16]

When I came to you, brothers and sisters, I did not come proclaiming the mystery of God to you in lofty words or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. And I came to you in weakness and in fear and in much trembling. My speech and my proclamation were not with plausible words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of the Spirit and of power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God.

⁶Yet among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. ⁷But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. ⁸None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. ⁹But, as it is written,

"What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived.

what God has prepared for those who love him"-

these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. ¹¹For what human being knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. ¹²Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God. [¹³And we speak of these things in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual things to those who are spiritual.

¹⁴Those who are unspiritual do not receive the gifts of God's Spirit, for they are foolishness to them, and they are unable to understand them because they are spiritually discerned.


¹⁵Those who are spiritual discern all things, and they are themselves subject to no one else's scrutiny.

MAIN FLOOR ENHANCEMENT PROJECT

For every time there is a season!

This is the season to consider the invitation to update and improve our Main Floor. The purpose of this brief article is to explain How We Got Here, give details about The Proposed Plan, and lay out the Next Steps.

How We Got Here

This project began four years ago. At a congregational meeting we designated some funds for ministry enhancement project. We set up a Task Force. However, it sputtered a bit as it sought to define which direction to embark. Then a key player on the Task Force relocated to another town. Then the pandemic hit. New people were added to the Task Force. Updates were provided at Annual Meetings. The Task Force consists of Linda Johnson, Donna Bergeron, Anne Krook and Chris Backman.

This year, the Task Force found traction. They narrowed their focus to the Main Floor. They analyzed how our space is used, and imagined how to enhance its function. They presented their proposal to our Church Council on January 21, 2023. The Proposed Project has a higher cost than the initial approval. Nonetheless, our Church Council gave full approval for this project to move ahead.

The Proposed Plan

The Enhancement Committee's mission is "to make design and interior improvements to beautify the church with an eye toward how use of the building can be optimized now and for the future."

The scope of the project is to refresh main floor rooms (other than the sanctuary and narthex). The main goal is to renovate and renew the spaces to be as useful and welcoming as possible to both current and potential new members.

Details include:

Creating a ten-foot opening between the Coffee Lounge and the Library.

The choir side wall of the Library will have a built-in electric fireplace and flat screen TV that can be used for presentations.

Asbestos has been confirmed in the ceiling material and will be addressed by encapsulating or removal.

New floor materials will be installed: carpet tile in most areas, porcelain tile in the bathrooms, and luxury vinyl planks in the workroom and kitchenette.

Current workroom will become multipurpose with expanded use as a larger kitchen area.

Lighting update and improved electrical outlets.

Installing new furniture and window coverings.

The Next Steps

- 1) Materials will be on display in the Library beginning January 29th.
- 2) Information will be sent out to the congregation by email. Questions about the project can be directed to the Church Office.
- 3) A presentation about this project will happen at our Annual Meeting today, Sunday, February 5 at 11am. There will be discussion, discernment and a vote.
- 4) Upon approval, the Council will move forward on a plan for additional funding.
- 5) It is estimated that construction will take 3-4 months and occur in the late summer and fall of 2023.
