WE HEAR GOD'S WORD

FIRST READING: Acts 10: 34-43

Peter began to speak to [the people]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all. ³⁷That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: ³⁸how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; ⁴⁰but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, ⁴¹not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴²He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."


Before the reading: Glory to you, O Lord!


The Distribution


- All are invited and all are welcome to come to the Lord's Table. All who wish to taste God's grace and forgiveness are welcome here.


NAVAJO EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN MISSION

This is the third and final year of our mission support of NELM. Over the past 2 years we have supported one class and 4 individual students each year providing funds for hygiene supplies, school supplies and transportation to and from school. Last year a contingent from Magnolia Lutheran gathered at Rock Point Arizona for a week of mission projects which included installing a solar generator for Darlene at her isolated, off grid residence. (Darlene is the person in the yellow pants in this photo by her home) Our projects also included working at the Mission food bank, painting the worship space, and paint for basketball court and classrooms.

This year we plan to support sponsorships for the second grade class; 4 individual students and provide the funds for the installation of 6 solar generators. Individual sponsorships are \$1,000 each and class sponsorship is \$3,000 for a total of \$7,000 plus funds to install generators at \$1,000 ea. for a total goal of \$13,000. Any funds raised in excess of our goal will be directed toward future student scholarships.
