

WE HEAR GOD'S WORD

FIRST READING: Jeremiah 20:7-13

⁷O LORD, you have enticed me, and I was enticed; you have overpowered me, and you have prevailed. I have become a laughingstock all day long; everyone mocks me. ⁸For whenever I speak, I must cry out, I must shout, "Violence and destruction!" For the word of the LORD has become for me a reproach and derision all day long.

⁹If I say, "I will not mention him, or speak any more in his name," then within me there is something like a burning fire shut up in my bones; I am weary with holding it in, and I cannot. ¹⁰For I hear many whispering: "Terror is all around! Denounce him! Let us denounce him!"

All my close friends are watching for me to stumble. "Perhaps he can be enticed, and we can prevail against him, and take our revenge on him." ¹¹But the LORD is with me like a dread warrior; therefore my persecutors will stumble, and they will not prevail. They will be greatly shamed, for they will not succeed. Their eternal dishonor will never be forgotten.

¹³Sing to the LORD; praise the LORD! For he has delivered the life of the needy from the hands of evildoers.

SECOND READING: Romans 6:1b-11


The Should we continue in sin in order that grace may abound? By no means! How can we who died to sin go on living in it? Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. For whoever has died is freed from sin. But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

³⁴"Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth; I have not come to bring peace, but a sword. ³⁵For I have come to set a man against his father, and a daughter against her mother, and a daughter-in-law against her mother-in-law; ³⁶and one's foes will be members of one's own household. ³⁷Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; ³⁸and whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me. ³⁹Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it."




Words of Institution (In the night he was betrayed...)

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.



A NOTE FROM PASTOR KEVIN


There is no longer a toilet on the main floor.

It has been removed. Along with the sinks. And some dry wall. The crew started the demolition this week. It is fascinating what lurks beneath. The steps beneath the carpeting are concrete. In a couple of places there is tile glued to tile. Mike is our in-house contractor. He has a small office in what used to be the nursery. Well, its not an office. It is a small table. Just big enough for his laptop.

I have been through a couple of church remodeling projects. I have learned a few things. One is this: it is good to have one person from the church be our contact with the contractor. That way the contractor does

not communicate with 20 people. Only one. Our person is Donna Bergeron. She serves on the

Enhancement Committee. She knows the construction trade.



A short time later, I bumped into Mike. I told him how grateful we were. How good it is to have one person from our committee to talk to him—instead of a bunch of us. Then I brought up the sign on the door. And how it said, Keep Out. And if there was any chance we could have a different mes-

sage on our outside door.

He smiled at me.

And in that moment, I realized what I had done. Immediately after I told Mike how good that we have appointed Donna talk to him—instead of a bunch of us—I

broke the very guideline we had set. I did not go to Donna.

I owned my faux pas. Look at me, I said to Mike. I just did the very thing I said we did not want to do. He laughed. I laughed, too. More importantly, I learned. And once again, I learned that the fullness of life is not lived by avoiding mistakes, but by embracing them when they come, and learn what they have to teach.

So, we are in a construction zone. There is not a toilet on the main floor. But there is a nice, BIG, clean porta potty just off the alley. And there are restrooms in the basement and another one upstairs near the classrooms.



And there is a new sign up on the external door. Danger, it says. Hard Hat Area! Which I suppose is a sign that every church should have. After all, God is at work here. And our lives will never be the same. My work is about hearing how God is at work remodeling our lives. But if you have a thought that might mean a change-order, it is best to go to Donna.
