




SECOND READING: James 2:14-18







The people are welcome and invited to sing during communion.





marked box in the Narthex. Thank you in advance for your ongoing



NAVAJO SUNDAY, TODAY, JULY 25TH

Today, July 25th, MLC's Social Action Committee will be demonstrating the generator that they will be donating to the Navajo's tribal home, see below. You will also learn about how you can sponsor one of the Navajo's and make a huge impact on their life!



MAGNOLIA LUTHERAN CHURCH SOLAR GENERATOR PROJECT Navaho Evangelical Lutheran Mission, Rock Point Arizona

Few know the challenges created by hunger, drought, job insecurity or loss like the Nava-jo. For those whose registered tribal home is Rock Point Arizona, about 173,000 in number, the distance between home and help of any kind is a minimum of 50 miles. For most healthcare, jobs and supplies require a full day plus a working vehicle, fuel and travel food to gather provisions needed for home and family... just to return to a home without electricity or running water. Less than half the households have both; this represents 70,000 individuals!

The solar charged generator project is designed to provide an affordable stand-alone solar system which can power many needs in a household. Lighting for nighttime medications and study, power for an electric blanket for nighttime warmth, enough power to run a small refrigerator and of course to charge devises. These very basic needs can be addressed with the solar powered generators which have become more affordable and dependable. MLC's goal will be to provide 5 households with power. Stay tuned for more information on how you can help!
